Make **WMSQUASH2018.COM** your first resource for information on the event and don't forget to sign up for the digital newsletter for instant updates during the tournament.



Use **CLUBLOCKER**. There are no paper score sheets and there are no paper draws ! We use i-pads & kindles for scoring and our TV monitors show the time and court number of your next match.



"THE NIGHT BEFORE CHECK YOUR DRAW!" Withdrawals can sometimes result in a late change to your match time and court number.



Questions? The **TOURNAMENT OPERATIONS DESK** is located on doubles court #9. The **CONCIERGE DESK** is close by there too - up on the doubles mezzanine.



Are you playing at McArthur today? Please note that 20% of matches are at **ST. ANNE'S BELFIELD SCHOOL** the alternate venue (designated on the draw by court numbers ST1 through ST5).



MSCG1 and **MSCG2** are our two show courts. Look ahead in the draw and if scheduled on either of these then we recommend you practice on them at some point prior to your match! Practice court availability can be seen on the tournament website under the **SCHEDULE** tab.



Though we recommend it, as long as you signed the waiver on registration you do not have to wear **PROTECTIVE EYEWEAR** on the court.



Always leave the ball on court afterwards and remember you and your opponent are the marker (loser) and referee (winner) of the next match on your court - unless told otherwise by one of our official ref's.



"THREE LOSSES & DONE, WANT ANOTHER ONE?" We will arrange an extra match for Friday August 3 - just let us know by filling out the **EXTRA MATCH FORM** at the the tournament desk.



Use **MOVE MEDICAL MASSAGE** for recovery and preparation (a service you pay for). Use our **TRAINER** if you should become injured (a service provided for free). Both are on site.

Check-In Procedure

On arrival in Charlottesville all participants should visit the Board Room at Boar's Head Pavilion to complete the tournament registration process.

Registration is July 27 to July 30, from 11:00am to 5:00pm each day. During this process our registration staff, Liz, Andrea, Chloe, Valerie, Diane and Sue will do all of the following:

1. A passport check to make sure you are entered in the right division based on the date of birth showing on your passport page. In the event of this being in dispute then WSF Technical delegate Julian Harniess will make the necessary ruling.
2. Give you your tournament "welcome bag" that includes your tournament t-shirt and \$20 Shops at Stonefield gift card.
3. Issue your tournament ID badge/lanyard. The lanyard clearly identifies if you have signed up to use our bus service or not and will need to be shown when you board the bus. If you have a guest with you for the event and they are signed up for the event transportation then make sure you collect their id badge and lanyard as part of your registration process.
4. Confirm the date, time and court number of your first match.
5. Confirm the function tickets that you have signed up for (though these will only be collected at the event itself).
6. Double check if you are booked on a return shuttle to Dulles or Richmond and if so on what day & time.
7. Collect any outstanding (cash only) payments that are necessary. This is only relevant for those that signed up for transport or tickets after our online store closed on July 2.
8. Collect a whatsapp/cell phone number that we might be able to reach you on in the event of an emergency.
9. Walk you through the use of clublocker from US Squash. This website is easy to navigate and is by far the best way of making sure you know when and where your next match is.
10. Cover some tournament essentials and answer any initial questions that you might need answered.



For those that arrive too late to go through registration process at the Pavilion then you can do this at the Tournament Operations Desk at McArthur Squash Center.

Rules and Regs from WSF

Championships Information

The Championships will be conducted under the World Squash Federation (WSF) World Championship Regulations.

Playing Regulations

All matches will be best of 5 games, point-a-rally scoring to 11.

19" tins will be used for all events.

All players should report to the relevant venue Tournament Office 30 minutes prior to the scheduled start time of every match.

A player may be disqualified and the match awarded to the opponent if he or she arrives 10 minutes or more after the scheduled start time or after the court becomes available, if later.

All players must wear appropriate squash clothing and non-marking shoes conforming to WSF regulations.

Players will be exempt from wearing protective eyewear, as required in USA, but only if they sign a risk waiver at the registration desk prior to playing their opening match.

By submitting an entry form for the WSF World Masters Squash Championships 2018 players agree to abide by the Rules and Regulations governing the Championships and declare as set out in section 17 below that they are aware of the Anti-Doping regulations and procedures as set out in Section W and Appendix G of the WSF World Championship Regulations. Under these regulations you accept that you may be tested at any stage of the Championships and will be subject to the penalties set out in the World Championship Regulations if the test(s) prove positive. This declaration also covers participation in Plate Events as applicable to this Championship.

All players enter and compete in the Championships at their own risk. The event organisers, the host venues, the sponsors, US Squash, and the WSF accept no liability whatsoever for injury or loss arising from participation in the Championships.

It is strongly recommended that all participants and non-players take out suitable insurance to cover themselves in the event of injury, loss, illness, or accident.

Players who book tickets on behalf of non-players do so at their own risk. The event organizers, the sponsors, US Squash, and the WSF accept no liability whatsoever for injury or loss incurred by a non-player arising from their presence at any of the functions, the venues, or from using the tournament transport.

Each player will have a minimum of 3 scheduled matches where possible. Players are expected to complete all scheduled matches and compete in all eligible plate draws and play-off matches as per WSF Regulation W12.

Official Ball

The WSF Championship ball, Dunlop double yellow dot, will be used for all matches in all age categories.

Refereeing

Officially qualified referees will be present throughout the Championships. However, all players are very likely to be required to mark/referee throughout the seven days of play. On completion of a match, unless told otherwise by tournament officials, the two players should always presume that they are required to ref/mark the next match on their court. The tournament policy is that the winner will referee and the loser will mark.

Each player will have a minimum of 3 scheduled matches where possible. Players are expected to complete all scheduled matches and compete in all eligible plate draws and play-off matches as per WSF Regulation W12.

Please only reserve one practice time per day and only reserve a show court for practice if your likely path through the draw has you playing on one. The show courts can be reserved one day ahead but no further. If you have reserved a show court for the next day but then find you no longer require it then please remember to cancel your booking to make it available for someone else.





St. Anne's-Belfield School



Matches being played at St. Anne's Belfield are shown with "ST" preceding the court number.

St. Anne's-Belfield School is a local prep school just 2.3 miles from Boar's Head and will act as our secondary venue for the event. The school has two local campuses and it is important to note that the 5 ASB squash courts are located at the Greenway Rise Campus. For directions and a map please follow the link below. Once you turn in to St. Anne's entrance on Ivy Road follow the hill upwards and the direction to the courts will be clearly signposted.

The St. Anne's facility will open for practice on Sunday, July 29; it will not be available prior to this date. Practice courts will be available from 10:30a.m. to 4:30p.m. on July 29 & July 30. Our tournament schedule has matches taking place at St. Anne's on July 31, August 1, and August 2—and then all matches will move to McArthur on semi-finals day (Friday, August 3). The majority of matches played at St. Anne's will be plate matches. Tournament Director Harry Smith and Assistant Tournament Director Grant White will be running all matches played at the St. Anne's venue.

There is plenty of parking adjacent to the squash building, and those signed up for our transportation service will be able to get to and from St. Anne's using either the [ST. ANNE'S SHUTTLE](#) or the [UTS TRANSPORT LOOP](#) service. St. Anne's will have light refreshments available for purchase in the form of Gatorade, energy bars, bananas, etc. One of our tournament sponsors, Ivy Provisions, is just a 2-3 minute walk away. They will be offering tournament discounts and daily specials to satisfy the breakfast and lunch cravings of anyone playing at the St. Anne's venue.

Please note that shower and changing facilities at the St. Anne's venue are extremely limited. We recommend that players shower back at their hotel or at McArthur Squash Center.

Nations Cup

The Nations Cup is an informal team element of the WSF World Masters Championship.

Format

The Nations Cup will consist of two divisions:

1. Division I: For teams entering 10 or more players in the World Masters Championships.
2. Division II: For teams entering 9 or fewer players in the World Masters Championships.

The aim of the competition is to generate team spirit among each country's players. The tournament committee also hopes that the Nations Cup will provide all players, not just the medal winners, the opportunity to play a part for their country. Any player who reaches the round of the last 16 or better, or who wins a plate competition, will be eligible to earn points for his or her team. This is a much broader based measure than a simple medals table.

Each country will appoint a team "Nations Cup Captain." Names of Nations Cup Captains, once confirmed, will be posted on the tournament website.

Scoring

Division I (countries with 10+ entrants in the event): The 25 highest scoring players from each country will contribute to their nation's points total. In order to be eligible as a "scoring player" a player must have played in and won at least one match in the tournament. Furthermore, they must have reached a scoring level in the event as described in the points table below.

Division II (countries with 9 or fewer entrants in the event): All players will contribute to their nation's points total provided they have won at least one match in the tournament and they earn a finishing position as described in the points table below.

Division I Teams*

USA (221), Canada (82), Australia (81), England (72), South Africa (67), Germany (31), Japan (21), Ireland (19), Netherlands (16), New Zealand (16), Pakistan (12), Scotland (12), India (11), and Mexico (10).

Division II Teams*

Brazil (9), Wales (9), Spain (8), France (7), Sweden (7), Argentina (6), Barbados (5), Namibia (5), Switzerland (5), Bangladesh (4), Bermuda (4), Cayman Islands (4), China (4), Finland (4), Egypt (3), Peru (3), Portugal (3), Trinidad and Tobago (3), Czech Republic (2), Guyana (2), Hong Kong China (2), Hungary (2), Israel (2), Malaysia (2), Norway (2), Singapore (2), Slovenia (2), Sri Lanka (2), Zambia (2), Zimbabwe (2), Austria (1), Botswana (1), British Virgin Islands (1), Chile (1), Guernsey (1), Iraq (1), Italy (1), Jersey (1), Lebanon (1), Monaco (1), Nigeria (1), Poland (1), St. Vincent and The Grenadines (1), United Arab Emirates (1)

* The number in parenthesis is the number of entrants from that country when the entry closed on June 15 - it does not take account of withdrawn players.



Points for the round of 16 will only apply to events with 32 or more entries.

Players must win one match to become a 'counter' in their team. Byes do not count as wins. Walk overs, withdraws, and retires do.

A player may not gain points from both the main draw and consolation events. In the event that a player earns points in both draws, the higher point total will count.

The Nation with the highest total tally of points will be declared winner of its respective draw.

A wall chart showing the round-by-round points earned by each country will be displayed at the main playing venues and on the tournament website.

In the Event of a Tie

In the event that two nations are tied, points will be awarded from the round of 32. Winners from the round of 32 will score 9 points. This will only occur in the event of a tie. Points will only be awarded if a player has won a match.

If no round of 32 players have won matches, Classic Plate Finalists will be scored at 7 points, Plate Finalists at 5 points, and Consolation Plate Finalists at 3 points.

The trophies, which were generously presented by the organizing committee of the 2016 World Masters in Johannesburg, are perpetual trophies and will record the name of the winning country at each World Masters Championships. The trophy will be presented at the Closing Ceremony Event.
